PASTOR'S MESSAGE:

*Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king,
behold, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem saying,
“Where is He who has been born King of the Jews?
For we have seen His star in the East
and have come to worship Him.” - Mt. 2:1-2*

The season of Epiphany begins on January 5th and ends on the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, which this year is on February 18th. While the Epiphany season tends to get upstaged by Christmas and Easter, it is the second oldest season in the church year. The seasons of Advent and Christmas were added to the liturgical year much later in the history of the church. The theme of Epiphany is the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles. The visit of the three wise men presenting their gifts to the boy Jesus, and falling down and worshiping Him, is the first Scriptural record of Gentiles recognizing Jesus as Christ, the Lord, and showing that He is not the Savior of the Jews only, but of all mankind. The Epiphany season also emphasizes the fact that the Christ is no mere man, but He is God come to us in the flesh. He is no distant, unattached deity, like all of the gods of man's imagination. The one true God comes into His creation, comes unto man, in order to rescue us from our fallen state. The epiphany of Jesus, then, is the manifestation to us of God who loves us, despite our fallen state, and comes, not to punish us, but to save us from eternal judgment, and to give us eternal life. For this, we give joyful thanks to the Lord.

"INVISIBLE"

And on the eighth day they came to circumcise the child. And they would have called him Zechariah after his father, but his mother answered, “No; he shall be called John.” And they said to her, “None of your relatives is called by this name.” And they made signs to his father, inquiring what he wanted him to be called. (Luke 1:59-62)

Just imagine how frustrated Elizabeth must have been with the neighbors. They won’t listen to her when she tells them the baby’s name—no, they have to go “over her head” to ask Zechariah. She probably wanted to throw something at them.

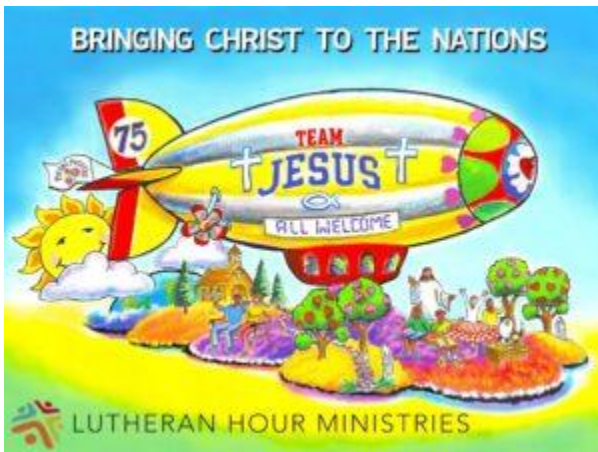
That kind of thing can make you feel like you’re invisible—like people are looking right past you to find someone who really matters. If it happens often enough, you may start believing them—that in fact you don’t matter, you have no value, and your feelings and opinions don’t count.

But God doesn’t overlook us—even the last, least, and lowest of us. It was for us that He was born into our world as a helpless baby. It was for us that Jesus taught and served and cared for people—and then allowed Himself to be betrayed into death, though He had done nothing wrong. Jesus knew that His death would set us free from the power of death—and His resurrection would lead directly to ours. How much do you matter? Enough for Jesus to give Himself for you—gladly.

WE PRAY: Lord, when I feel invisible, remind me that You see me and care for me, please. Amen.

Building off the parade theme of “The Magic in Teamwork,” the 2026 Lutheran Hour Ministries float entry is titled “Bringing Christ to the Nations®” and marks the 75th time the ministry has been part of the parade. The float will feature a “Team Jesus” blimp flying over the world. Coming forth from the church, Jesus celebrates with 12 modern-day disciples, as it features the message ALL WELCOME. “Team Jesus” serves as a reminder that it takes everyone to fulfill the callings Christ has placed upon us to do the work of bringing Christ and His redeeming love to the world. Riders on the 2026 float will represent some of the vocations Christ has called us for the building of His church and furtherance of the Gospel message: a teacher, a missionary, a pastor, and others. Additional

symbolism will include the Luther Seal on the nose of the blimp, crosses on the side, “75” on the tail in honor of our 75th year having a Christian float in the parade, and a **Petal Pushers®** banner to highlight the annual volunteer efforts of around 4,000 individuals.

The LHM float will be positioned as the 33rd entry in the 2026 parade. The float should pass by the Grandstand between approximately 8:40 and 8:50 a.m. PST.

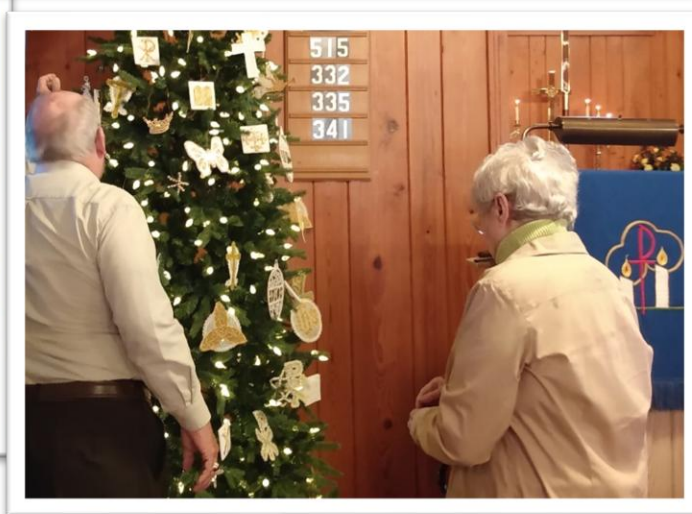

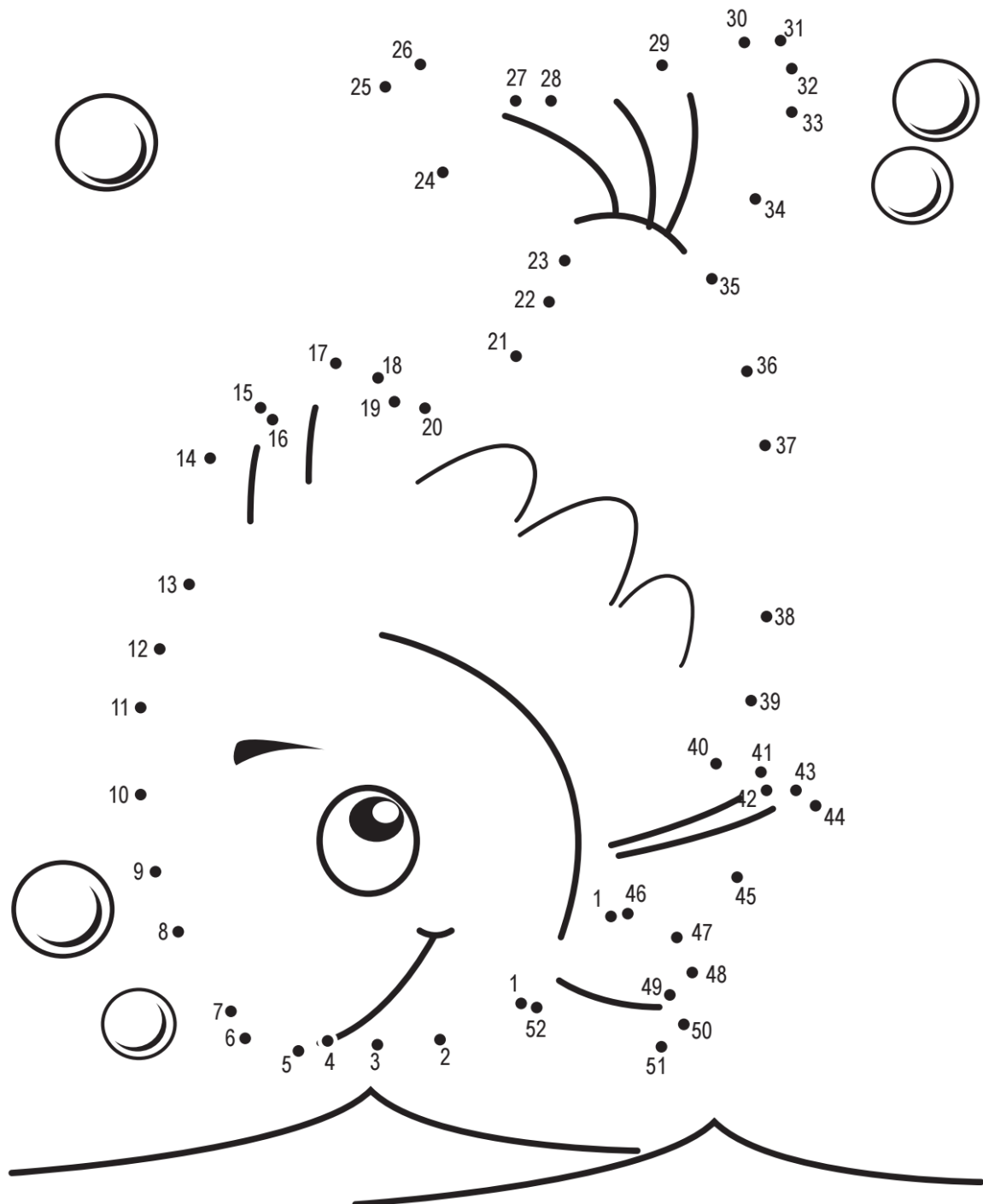

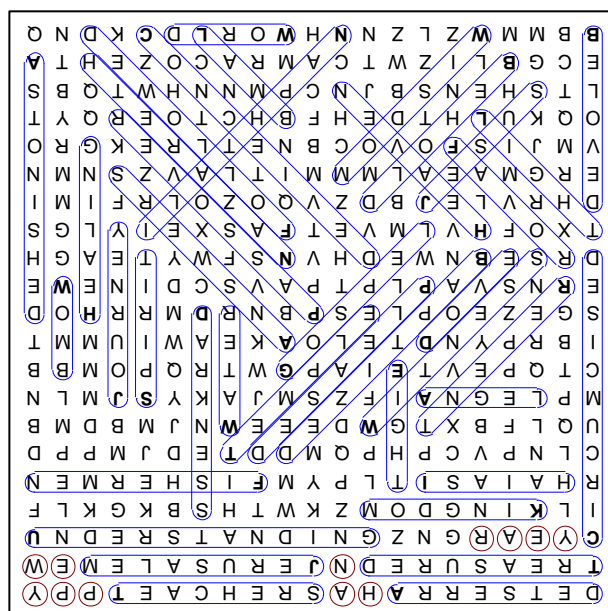
